**Gate Cards Required to access KCCB**

Cable airport has started closing all the gates. You must have a Gate/ID card. Each person on the airside portion of the airport is expected to have a Cable Gate/ID card or be accompanied by someone who does. The card costs \$25 and may be obtained by calling Bill Blanchard at 909-518-4662 to make an appointment. Bill said EAA members may have gate cards, you just have to sign up and pay the fee.

If you don't have a card now, getting to our meetings has been somewhat restricted. We have made arrangements with the airport to have the North, Benson avenue gate open from 10am - 2:00pm on the second Saturday of month for our meeting. If you get to the airport early, or stay late, you may have to find someone to escort you through a gate.

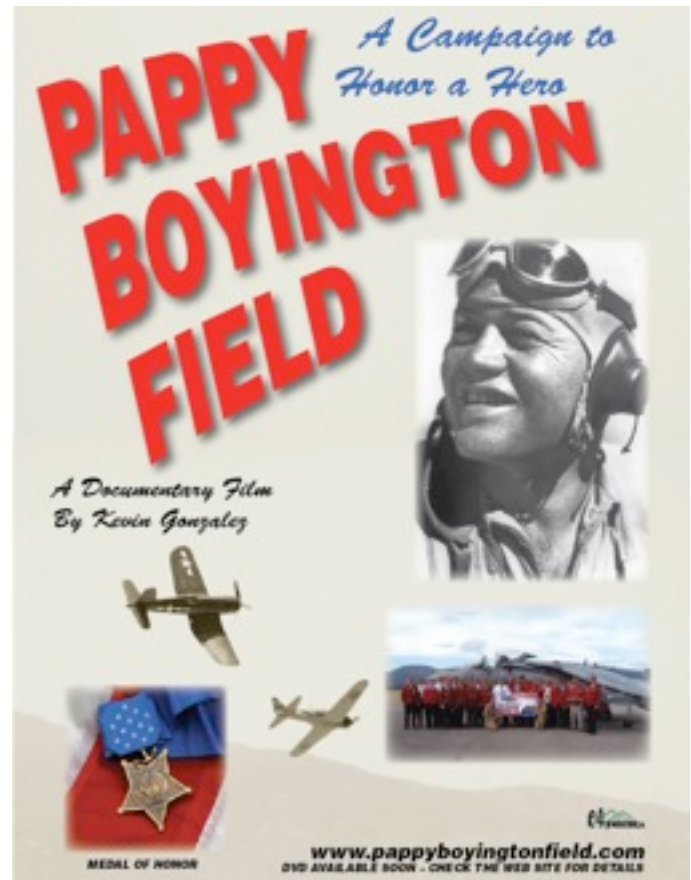
